PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE
RE: 662 MAIN STREET

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of the City of New Rochelle, New York, will hold a Public Hearing on Tuesday, June 14, 2016, at 7:00 P. M., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, 515 North Avenue, New Rochelle, New York, relative to the proposed designation of 662 Main Street (former New Rochelle Public Library) as an historic landmark.

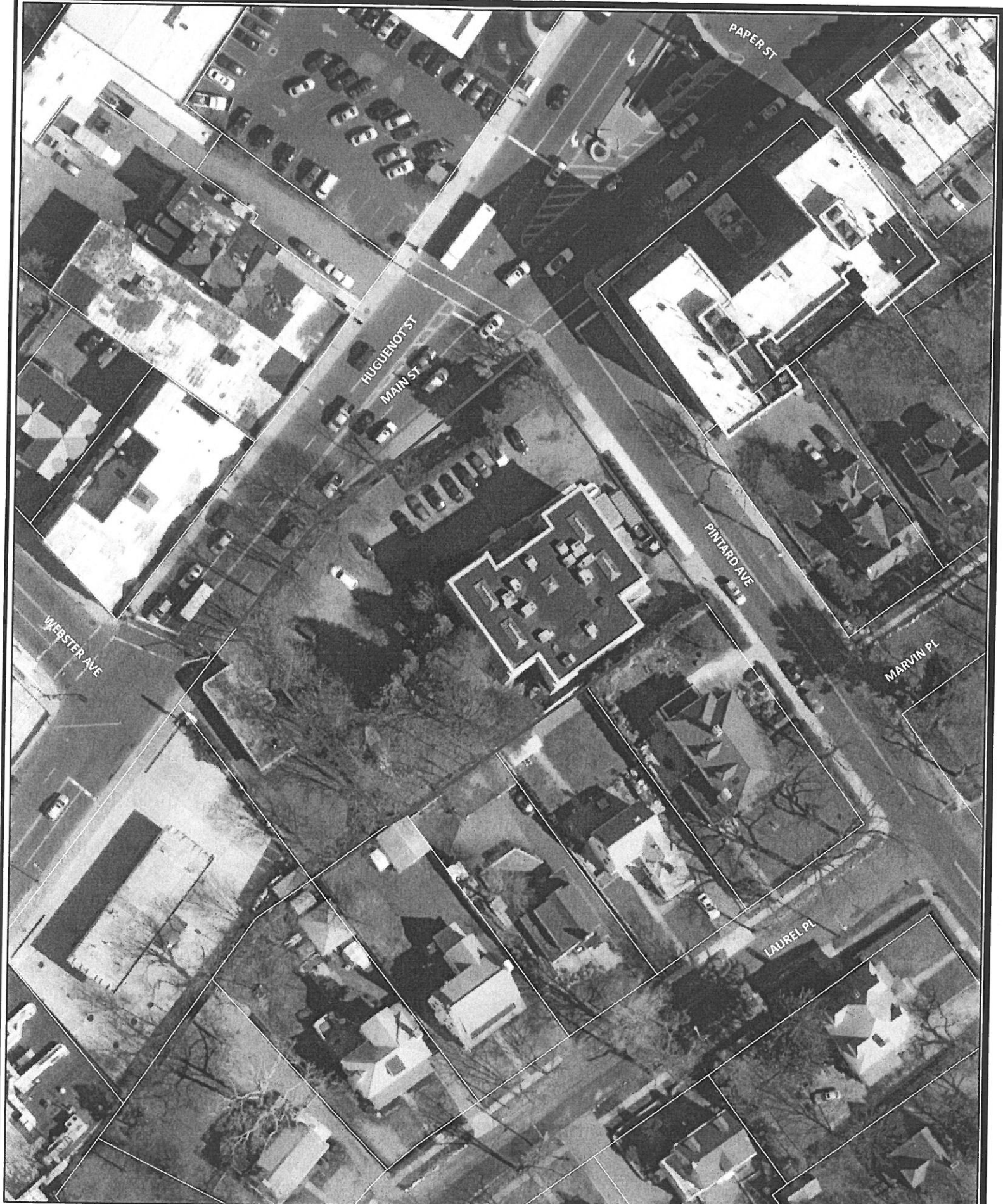
The proposed designation is based on the request received by the Historic and Landmarks Review Board (HLRB) from a local resident in January, 2016, to nominate 662 Main Street, the former Carnegie Library, as a local landmark. Following a Public Hearing on March 9, 2016, the HLRB voted unanimously in favor of the request.

The library, a neo-Classical Revival institutional building designed by Albert Randolph Ross and built by prominent New Rochelle master builder, Michael Barnett, served as New Rochelle's library from its opening in 1914 until 1979, and is one of three Carnegie library buildings still standing in Westchester County. The building is currently owned by Hagedorn Communications.

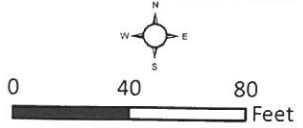
All persons interested are invited to attend said Public Hearing or submit written communications to the City Clerk at or before the Public Hearing.
