  - The Sharing Shelf is Westchester's Clothing Bank for Children founded to combat clothing insecurity among low-income children and families in our community. TSS collects new and gently used clothing for infants, children and teens. That clothing is sorted by quality then distributed to local, low-income children at no cost through nonprofits, schools, hospitals and community groups in Westchester County.
  - TSS does not work directly with families but supports those in nonprofits to meet the needs of their students, clients and children of clients.
  - Other essentials:
    - Diapers: Partnership with Westchester County's Diaper Bank to help meet this critical need and provides diapers to each infant or diaper-wearing toddler who receives clothing.
    - Backpacks to School: Each summer, TSS launches its Backpacks to School initiative to fill and distribute new backpacks with new grade appropriate school supplies.
    - Teen Boutique: Twice a year, free, one-day shopping boutique for girls ages 13-19, from families in financial need organized in partnership with various community groups. This has been re-imagined during Covid and TSS will pack clothing bags for teen girls.
    - Feminine Hygiene: Provides tampons and pads for the teens it serves and can support area nonprofits (i.e. food pantries) to meet this need.
