- K. Inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1972, he penned "Santa Claus is Comin' to Town" (1932)
- L. This building is behind lakes once used for ice-making and rose from the ashes of a major fire in 1968.
- M. Steelworker's son, track star and famous centerfielder
- N. Art deco styling graces this building near Memorial Hwy.
- O. 1956 Olympic gold medalist in the 4x400 meter and winner 400 meters at 1955 Pan American Games
- P. The celebrated artist of America's West created his major paintings and sculptures while living in New Rochelle.
- Q. Artist and Illustrator most famous for covers of the Saturday Evening Post.
- R. First heard on radios across America, this famous ventriliquist went on to host the nations' most popular children's television program
- S. "El Padrino" assisted newcomers from Cotija, Quitupan and Jiquilpan, Mexico to find jobs, housing and a new life in New Rochelle
- T. He produced the first Technicolor cartoon and created some of America's most beloved cartoon characters
- U. This 19th century mode of transportation connected wealthy Manhattanites with the waterfront resort community of New Rochelle
- V. Once a "summer cottage", this beautiful stone "castle" is on a vibrant college campus in Residence Park
- W. His writings fanned the flames of the American Revolution and his statue is on North Avenue
- X. At the turn of the 20th century, this was the favored mode of transportation before cars and trains
- Y. Suffragist and founder of the League of Women Voters
